Climate Change – U.S. Policy and Corporate GHG Management

The reality of climate change is upon us and, even without any commitment from the White House to the Kyoto Protocol, businesses in the U.S. are reacting to world pressure and starting to take action to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. There are numerous voluntary GHG programs throughout the country – ranging from State or regional reporting requirements to GHG trading schemes. Meanwhile, in Europe they are currently gearing up for a mandatory GHG trading scheme due to be fully implemented by 2008.



Dr Richard Moss of the U.S. Climate Change Science Program Office will give us a cutting edge look at the science of climate change and tell us what that means for businesses in the U.S. **Mike Scott** from ENVIRON will present a review of Federal and State climate change programs and a practical corporate GHG strategy.
